#### The Offing by Benjamin Myers.

Our November read followed the fictional travels of young sixteen year old Robert Appleyard as he set out from his Durham mining village on a Laurie Lee type escapade. The story is written by Robert in his old age looking back on his youthful adventure one summer, just after the end of WW2.

His proposed walk to cover a large stretch of the country is waylaid by Dulcie, an eccentric older woman with a worldly knowledge of life, with whom he establishes an unlikely friendship. She herself has a tragic secret which we understand as a group was based on a true story set in Robin Hood's Bay.

The first 10% of the book is written in a lyrical/poetical style which was quite dense. One needs to work one's way through the opening chapters before being drawn into the story proper, that deals with his coming of age, discovering there is a greater world out there.

For Robert was it to follow your father down the pit or as Dulcie puts it: After all, there are only a few things truly worth fighting for: freedom, of course, and all that it brings with it. Poetry, perhaps, and a good glass of wine. A nice meal. Nature. Love, if you're lucky.

Overall we felt this was an enjoyable read, to be recommended.
