Fine wine tasting Thurs 25th Nov Exircuil Roger Amsden



Twelve thirsty souls arrived for a warm welcome at Chez Leslie and Annette our hosts for the evening, eagerly anticipating the promised selection of fine wines presented by our wine expert Keith Mousdale.

The first on the list was a Chablis. Premier Cru AoP from Vocoret and Fils Vieilles 2020. Cepage: 100% Chardonnay. Alc;13.5% around 15.50€. This is a medium bodied dry white wine. Not to be confused with The Grand Cru, and goes well with shell fish, crab, lobster, white meat and goats cheese. I found it not as buttery as one would perhaps expect from a Chardonnay, even though I do like that I did enjoy the difference. It had a sweet taste initially with a hint of fruit and pear and apple but not a particularly lasting

finish. Would go well with the forementioned food pairing, chilled on a warm day overlooking the sea. The second was a red wine. St-Emillion Clos des Jacobins 2015 Grand Cru Classé around 27€. Not to be confused with the Grand Cru which is very different and generally overpriced and overrated.

Cepage: Merlot 80%, Cabinet Franc and Cabinet Sauvignon. Alc 14.5%. This Grand Cru Classé is reviewed regularly by a committee to ensure its quality. Well-aged to reduce tannings with a good nose, lots of fruit especially spice with depth and a lasting finish, goes well as you would expect with Beef, Venison Asian and rich fish dishes. Then onto the Languedoc. Domaine de L'Hortus Grand Curvée 2019. Around 22€. Appellation: Pic-Saint-Loup AoP. Cepage: Syrah, Mourvedre and Grenache. Alc: 14.5%. Here we have black fruit, liquorice, cedar and leather but the former escaped me. A light fruity nose, Silky and lighter in depth with a light finish. A refined wine and well balanced flavour. Pairs well with Lamb and lighter meats. Finally A red Burgundy. Domain Faiveley Mercury `"La Framboisière" Monopole 2016. Around 29€. Appellation: Mercury

AoP. Cepage: Pinot Noir 100%. Alc. 15%. A wine with a fruity nose, initially sweet but soon developing into medium and fruity flavour with a hint of oak and a light but pleasing finish. Will go well with Beef Wellington; Game stew and capon with mushrooms. Also with chocolate and lemon cake. Beware, wine first then chocolate as the chocolate completely destroys the wine.

Our grateful thanks to Keith and Diane for a well presented sourced and thought out collection especially the preparation of the relevant recommended food pairings to go with them. Also to Annette and Leslie our hosts.
