A Single Thread by Tracey Chevalier

1932. After the Great War took both her beloved brother and her fiancé, Violet Speedwell has become a "surplus woman," one of a generation doomed to a life of spinsterhood after the war killed so many young men. Yet Violet cannot reconcile herself to a life spent caring for her grieving, embittered mother. After countless meals of boiled eggs and dry toast, she saves enough to move out of her mother's place and into the town of Winchester, home to one of England's grandest cathedrals. There, Violet is drawn into a society of broderers--women who embroider kneelers for the Cathedral, carrying on a centuries-long tradition of bringing comfort to worshippers.

Violet finds support and community in the group, fulfillment in the work they create, and even a growing friendship with the vivacious Gilda. But when forces threaten her new independence and another war appears on the horizon, Violet must fight to put down roots in a place where women aren't expected to grow. Told in Chevalier's glorious prose, A Single Thread is a timeless story of friendship, love, and a woman crafting her own life. A small bunch of us met at Clare's on Wednesday, thank you Clare for hosting and your warm welcome.

The book was Love After Love by Ingrid Persaud as recommended by Clare

The book is about a 'family unit' made up on Mum, son and a lodger. It explores many themes including sexuality, self-harm and what is means to be a family.

A few of us thought that the language was difficult to follow, but after a few chapters this did improve. The book was written with dialect that we were unfamiliar with. Discussions centred around language, love, being a misfit, misunderstood and fear. I'm making it sound like a depressing book which is wasn't at all. We all thought the characters where really well rounded and brilliantly painted. The word 'authentic' was used a lot – the book showed us many authentic discussions and characters and was refreshingly open. However some of the themes were also overwhelming to some readers.

The end was sad, lovely and hopeful. One expression discussed was that the book showed you that you "have to press on with life, even if you can't see a way out"

Words were: authentic; forthright; loneliness and awkward

"We are forever getting more than we can bear. Always. It's just that we don't have a choice in the matter."
