The book for the month of June is Fresh Water for Flowers by Valerie Perrin

Violette Toussaint is a caretaker at a cemetery in a small town in Bourgogne. Her daily life is lived to the rhythm of the hilarious and touching confidences of random visitors and her colleagues - three gravediggers, three groundskeepers and a priest.

Violette's routine is disrupted one day by the arrival of police chief Julien Seul, wishing to deposit his mother's ashes on the gravesite of a complete stranger. Julien is not the only one to guard a painful secret: his mother's story of clandestine love breaks through Violette's carefully constructed defences to reveal the tragic loss of her daughter and her steely determination to find out who is responsible.

The funny, moving, intimately told story of a woman who believes obstinately in happiness, Fresh Water for Flowers brings out the exceptional and the poetic in the ordinary. A delightful, atmospheric and absorbing tale.

A select group of just 6 members met together to discuss 'The Tin nose Shop' by Don Snyder

The underlying theme of this novel was the enormous damage both physical and mental inflicted on so many young soldiers sent out to fight by their elders. The 'tin nose' of the title was the metal face masks being developed during WW1 to cover the facial disfigurements resulting from the fighting. However the attitudes of the time to supposed cowardice which is now defined as PTSD, the long lasting but invisible psychic wounds suffered by the injured but also by the apparently unhurt soldiers and the post-war prospects of life in the civilian community are all treated with empathy in this book. Everybody in the group felt it was an important read to be recommended.
